- 6. Minutes: The Minutes of the meeting held on 8th and 28th May 2020 were taken as read and will be signed as being a true record at the next proper meeting

7. Matters Arising:

- a. <u>Enforcement matters</u>: Updates were given to the Committee. See Appendix A to these Minutes
- **b.** <u>Notice Boards</u>: These have been ordered and will be delivered after the lockdown
- **Blind House**: An application to be made to English Heritage for the work to the stonework and to the repairs to the toilet The quotation for the repairs to the stonework by Marcus Mitchell in the sum of £380 had been accepted. Additional quotation sought for the storm damage. Quotations had been sought for the repairs to the toilet seat and bed but only one had been received.
 It is <u>recommended</u> that the quotation from Acorn Joinery in the sum of £482 + Vat for the manufacture of the toilet seat and lid and £275 + vat for the manufacture of bed slats be accepted. These would be made in oak.

- e. <u>Bus shelters:</u> The guttering on the shelter by The Bassetts had come down in the strong winds. Mr Walton had offered to supply an oak board to replace the fascia board which is rotten. His offer had been accepted. Quotations being sought for the painting of the shelters
- e. <u>Settlement boundary review</u>: Waiting the outcome of the consultation
- f. Light pollution Deferred to the next proper meeting
- 8. Neighbourhood Plan; Briefing note on Housing Land Supply received from Wiltshire Council. Cllr Botterill stated that he felt that the structure of the Steering Committee needed to be reinforced and an advert will be put in the Parish Magazine for more volunteers. The Steering Committee should work more closely with the Planning & Conservation Committee. The Neighbourhood Plan would take up to 18 months to 2 years to complete. Cllr Botterill agreed to speak to Lemon Gazelle about the way forward.

Planning permission had been granted.

It was reported that the pond has now gone. An extension is being built across the back of the house under permitted development but the work has stopped because the development is too large.

The previous objections still stand. These are new buildings in the Green Belt and AoNB although within the settlement framework. The Parish Council feels that this is overcrowding and lacks amenity space. There are also concerns over the safety of the access.

Strong objections. This is out of character and detrimental to the Grade II Listed Building. The Parish Council do not agree with

	the change of location as this now makes the building more prominent. If this were to be granted there should be a condition that it remains ancillary to the main dwelling
