6. Minutes: The Minutes of the meetings held on 14th and 31st October 2024 were taken as read and signed as being a true record

7. Matters Arising:

c. <u>Bus shelters</u>: A report on the condition of the bus shelters had been received together with two quotations in the sum of £473 and £1535. Because of the dispartity in the two quotations it was agreed to survey the residents to see how many use the bus shelter. Cllr Barton offered to remove and dispose of the asbestos. Clerk to ask for a revised quote to take account of this.

d. <u>Enforcement matters</u>:

<u>Quarry Woods</u>: The hearing at the High Court was held on 23^{rd} October. The Defendant had failed to remove the wooden toilet building and the wooden jetty platform. The Defendant indicated that he would remove these in November 2024. The hearing was adjourned to the first open date after 2^{nd} December when he could be committed for contempt of court if he failed to remove the buildings.

<u>Erection of wooden structure at Leafy Lane Woodlands</u>: An application had been submitted but was invalid as it needed an Ecology report. The Enforcement Officer will pursue this
